Building 155 is a rectangular two-story concrete barracks building. A two-story staircase bay, with large fixed windows in metal sash, is located on the south side. Fixed and transom ribbon windows in metal sash, protected by the eaves on the second floor or the concrete canopies on the first floor, light the long (north and south) sides of the building. The shallow-pitched gable roof has widely overhanging eaves. Staircases, protected by concrete canopies, are located at the short (east and west) ends of the building. Port holes provide light to these staircases. Metal doors with wire glass upper panes provide access at the center of the building on the north and south sides. The long walls are broken up visually by two-story piers. All the windows have been replaced and some repositioned with compatible steel framed windows. All the doors have been replaced as well with compatible metal single doors and metal and glass double doors.


